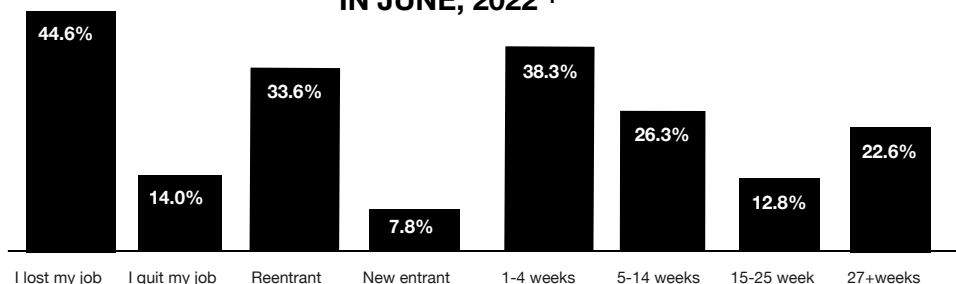

REASON FOR UNEMPLOYMENT AND LENGTH OF UNEMPLOYMENT IN JUNE, 2022 ¹



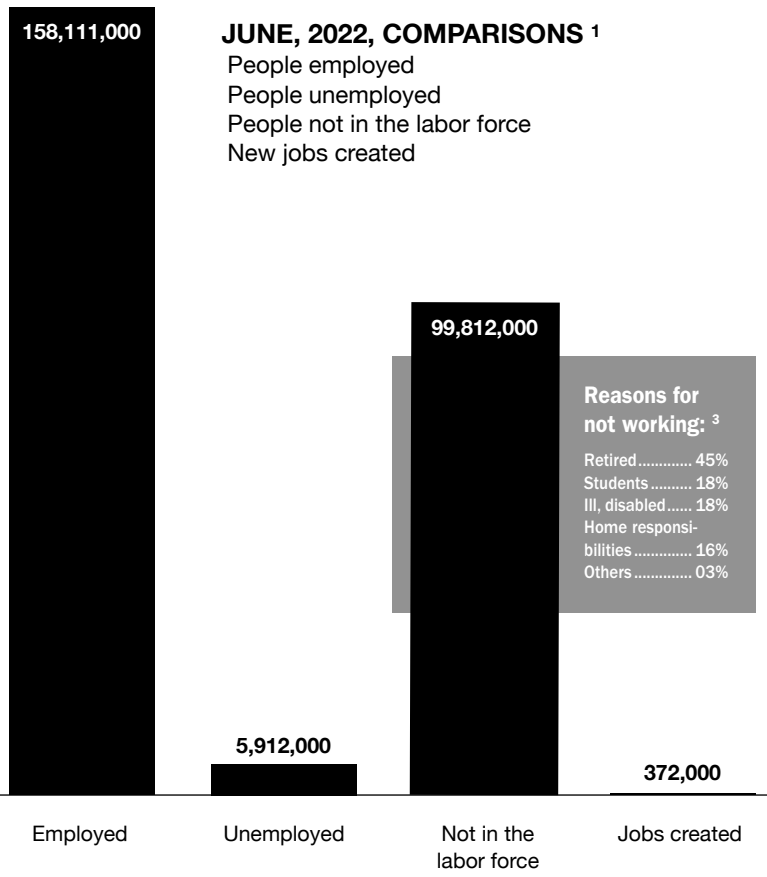
